The Vice-President of the Council (Czech Republic) opened the meeting.

Coordination, programme and other questions: African countries emerging from conflict [item 12 (e)]

The Council began its consideration of the sub-item.

Introduction of the report (E/2017/68) and general discussion

The Chair of the Peacebuilding Commission and Permanent Representative of the Republic of Korea to the United Nations, His Excellency Cho Tae-Yul, briefed the

Council on the work of the Peacebuilding Commission in African countries emerging from conflict.

The United Nations Resident Coordinator ad interim and United Nations Children's Fund Country Representative in South Sudan made an introductory statement, via audio link.

Statements were made by the representatives of the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees and the United Nations Entity for Gender Equality and the Empowerment of Women, as well as the Food and Agricultural Organization of the United Nations and the World Health Organization.

The Council thus concluded its general discussion of agenda item 12 (e).

The Council adopted the draft resolution (resolution 2017/29).

The Council thus concluded its consideration of sub-item 18 (a) and agenda item 18 as a whole.

50th meeting

The Vice-President of the Council (Czech Republic) opened the meeting.

Implementation of the Declaration on the Granting of Independence to Colonial Countries and Peoples by the specialized agencies and the international institutions associated with the United Nations [item 14]

Economic and social repercussions of the Israeli occupation on the living conditions of the Palestinian people in the Occupied Palestinian Territory, including East Jerusalem, and the Arab population in the occupied Syrian Golan [item 16]

The Council began its joint consideration of the items.

Introduction of the reports ([A/72/87-E/2017/67](#) and [A/72/90-E/2017/71](#)) and general discussion

The Director of the Emerging and Conflict Related Issues Section, United Nations Economic and Social Commission for Western Asia, introduced the reports of the

Secretary-General ([A/72/87–E/2017/67](#) (under item 14) and [A/72/90–E/2017/71](#) (under item 16)).

Comments were made and questions were posed by the representatives of Lebanon (on behalf of the Arab States) and the Bolivarian Republic of Venezuela, as well as by the observers for the Syrian Arab Republic and the State of Palestine, to which the Director responded.

Action on draft resolution [E/2017/L.34](#)

The representative of Ecuador (on behalf of the Group of 77 and China), made a statement and introduced the draft resolution.

Turkey joined as sponsor of the draft resolution.

Statements before the vote were made by the representatives of Estonia (on behalf of the European Union) and the United States.

A statement on a point of order was made by the representative of Ecuador, to which the Vice-President (Czech Republic) responded.

The Council adopted the draft resolution by a recorded vote of 45 to 2, with 3 abstentions (resolution 2017/30).

After the vote, general statements were made by the representative of the Bolivarian Republic of Venezuela and the observers for the State of Palestine and Israel.

The Permanent Representative of the Bolivarian Republic of Venezuela to the United Nations and Chair of the Special Committee on the Situation with regard to the Implementation of the Declaration on the Granting of Independence to Colonial Countries and Peoples, His Excellency Rafael Darío Ramírez Carreño, introduced the report of the Secretary-General ([A/72/69](#) (under item 14)).

Action on draft resolution [E/2017/L.33](#)

The Chair of the Special Committee made a statement and introduced the draft resolution, also on behalf of the sponsors listed in the document.

The Council was informed that the draft resolution contained no programme budget implications.

A statement was made by the representative of the Russian Federation.

Before the vote, a statement was made by the representative of the United States.

The Council adopted the draft resolution by a recorded vote of 21 to 0, with 22 abstentions (resolution 2017/31).

After the vote, statements were made by the representatives of Argentina and France.

Oral decision

The Council decided to further postpone the nomination of two members of the African States, one member of the Latin American and Caribbean States and three members of the Western European and other States, for a three-year term beginning on 1 January 2018 and expiring on 31 December 2020; and two members of the Western European and other States, both terms beginning on the date of election by the General Assembly and one term expiring on 31 December 2017, and the second term expiring on 31 December 2018.

Executive Board of the World Food Programme

The Council elected Lesotho, by acclamation, to fill an outstanding vacancy on the Executive Board for a three-year term beginning on 1 January 2018 and expiring on 31 December 2020, for List A.

*Governing Council of the United Nations Human Settlements Programme
(UN-Habitat)*

The Council elected Spain, by acclamation, to fill an outstanding vacancy on the Governing Council for a term beginning on 26 July 2017 and expiring on 31 December 2020.

The Council also decided to further postpone the election of one member from the Latin American and Caribbean States, for a term beginning on the date of election and expiring on 31 December 2020; and five members from the Western European and other States for terms all beginning on the date of election, and expiring as follows: two members for terms expiring on 31 December 2018; one member for a term expiring on 31 December 2019; and two members for terms expiring on 31 December 2020.

Organizational Committee of the Peacebuilding Commission

The Council elected Romania, by acclamation, in accordance with Council resolution 2015/1 of 4 March 2015, for a term beginning on 1 January 2018 and expiring on 31 December 2018, to replace Estonia whose membership in the Economic and Social Council will expire on 31 December 2017.

Postponement of the appointment of the 25 experts to the Committee of Experts on International Cooperation in Tax Matters

The Council was informed that the appointment by the Secretary-General of the 25 experts to the Committee of Experts in International Cooperation in Tax Matters had been postponed to a later date.
